- Pinney is trying again. Would you? Ginnie tells Pinney to keep trying. Why? Do you have a different solution to help Pinney? How is Pinney feeling?
- Pinney thinks he can make the best kite ever. What is more important: Making the best thing or trying hard to make something in the best way you can? How is Pinney behaving? Is he the best kite maker? Explain your reason.
- Did Pinney mean to get his kite tangled? What could he have done differently? How are the friends feeling? How is Pinney feeling? Would you help Pinney? Should friends help each other? Why?
- Who did make the dragon kite?
- Has anyone in the story learnt any lessons?
